⁵⁰ And a man named Joseph, who was a member of the Council, a good and righteous man ⁵¹(he had not consented to their plan and action), *a man* from Arimathea, a city of the Jews, who was waiting for the kingdom of God; ⁵² this man went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. ⁵³ And he took it down and wrapped it in a linen cloth, and laid Him in a tomb cut into the rock, where no one had ever lain. ⁵⁴ It was the preparation day, and the Sabbath was about to begin. ⁵⁵ Now the women who had come with Him out of Galilee followed, and saw the tomb and how His body was laid. ⁵⁶ Then they returned and prepared spices and perfumes. And on the Sabbath they rested according to the commandment.

24 But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb bringing the spices which they had prepared. ² And they found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³ but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴ While they were perplexed about this, behold, two men suddenly stood near them in dazzling clothing; ⁵ and as *the women* were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, *the men* said to them, “Why do you seek the living One among the dead? ⁶ He is not here, but He has risen. Remember how He spoke to you while He was still in Galilee, ⁷ saying that the Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and the third day rise again.” ⁸ And they remembered His words, ⁹ and returned from the tomb and reported all these things to the eleven and to all the rest. ¹⁰ Now they were Mary Magdalene and Joanna and Mary the *mother* of James; also the other women with them were telling these things to the apostles. ¹¹ But these words appeared to them as nonsense, and they would not believe them. ¹² But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen wrappings only; and he went away to his home, marveling at what had happened.

MISSION FOCUS

Mission to the World 2017 Compassion Offering

Last July, South Sudan’s fragile peace was shattered as fighting broke out between government troops and rebels in the capital city. As the violence escalated, thousands fled. That’s when Jeremy Martin, with MTW’s team in Kampala, Uganda, got the call—500 people were trapped between Juba and the Ugandan border. They needed help.

The MTW team received \$10,000 from the PCA Compassion Fund to rescue as many of the refugees as they could manage. With the help of a Ugandan military convoy, they transported 480 South Sudanese safely into camps across the border where the refugees were able to find food, shelter, and hear the gospel.

Two years ago MTW missionaries in rural Zimbabwe began an economic empowerment program to help church members become financially self-sufficient: raising flocks of free-range chickens to sell to restaurants in the city. But when the rains failed, so did the crops, and the chickens were going to be eaten. The program, which had begun to make a real difference, was doomed to failure.

Compassion funds given by the PCA came to the rescue: corn meal, cooking oil, and beans were distributed to people in three area churches over a period of six months, meeting basic survival needs and enabling the chicken farming to continue. The distribution was also used as an outreach to others who came to the church center for help.

People were given the hope of the gospel in word and deed. And your brothers and sisters in Zimbabwe were greatly encouraged by your generosity.

This year would you be willing to extend compassion to a world in need? With your help we’ll be there to meet them and demonstrate the tangible love of Jesus to a world in need of Him.
