COMMUNITY IMPACT

Friends, Kids, and Families, if you took one of the **Habitat for Humanity banks**, we are collecting them outside the reception office through the end of the year.

Community High School (CHS): Operation Christmas Child is a well-known service project in churches but have you (or your kids) ever wished you could pack a shoebox for a local child, or better yet, give them a gift you KNOW they really want? Well this year we all have a chance to do that! Trinity is partnering with Community High School in Swannanoa to give all of their students a gift for Christmas. Most of these students would ordinarily not be getting much, if anything, and because they are right down the street, we have a chance to get each of them something they'd really like to have, personalize it (with a note or Christmas card), wrap it, and (if you'd like) even be a part of giving it to them in person in December!

MISSION FOCUS

Neighborhood Care Groups

Our Neighborhood Care Groups exist "to strengthen the body of Christ by drawing in, knowing and caring for each other's spiritual and physical needs in simple and helpful ways, and by creating smaller communities within the larger congregation." We strive for this goal by encouraging neighborly relationships (N), providing a framework for providing spiritual, practical and compassionate care (C) for church members, and by grouping Trinity members into smaller groups that are geographically close (G).

Each Neighborhood Care Group consists of an elder, a deacon, two NCG coordinators and the Trinity members in a designated area. Elders are called to shepherd, offer spiritual guidance and overall leadership within the NCG. Deacons are called to offer practical helps and mercy. The NCG coordinators assist the deacons by organizing meals and other assistance for members in need.

Trinity members are encouraged to participate in scheduled gatherings and contribute when there is a call for help from the NCG leadership. All Trinity members and covenant children are placed in a NCG according to their home address. To volunteer or ask questions please talk to Julie Eargle or Joy Voigt.
