Walking with Jesus through the Gospel of Luke Luke 24:13-27 (NASB) | *Walking with the Risen Savior* Chad Smith

¹³ And behold, two of them were going that very day to a village named Emmaus, which was about seven miles from Jerusalem. ¹⁴ And they were talking with each other about all these things which had taken place. ¹⁵ While they were talking and discussing, Jesus Himself approached and *began* traveling with them. ¹⁶ But their eyes were prevented from recognizing Him. ¹⁷ And He said to them, “What are these words that you are exchanging with one another as you are walking?” And they stood still, looking sad. ¹⁸ One of them, named Cleopas, answered and said to Him, “Are You the only one visiting Jerusalem and unaware of the things which have happened here in these days?” ¹⁹ And He said to them, “What things?” And they said to Him, “The things about Jesus the Nazarene, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word in the sight of God and all the people, ²⁰ and how the chief priests and our rulers delivered Him to the sentence of death, and crucified Him. ²¹ But we were hoping that it was He who was going to redeem Israel. Indeed, besides all this, it is the third day since these things happened. ²² But also some women among us amazed us. When they were at the tomb early in the morning, ²³ and did not find His body, they came, saying that they had also seen a vision of angels who said that He was alive. ²⁴ Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just exactly as the women also had said; but Him they did not see.” ²⁵ And He said to them, “O foolish men and slow of heart to believe in all that the prophets have spoken! ²⁶ Was it not necessary for the Christ to suffer these things and to enter into His glory?” ²⁷ Then beginning with Moses and with all the prophets, He explained to them the things concerning Himself in all the Scriptures.

Beyond Brisbane International Project

Without a doubt, one of my favourite things about Australia is its diversity of students from all around the world. At the beginning of this year at the University of Queensland we hosted our annual 2-week Beyond Brisbane Student Project with the vision to reach and connect with the thousands of international students preparing to study for the 2017 semesters.

This year was especially amazing in that our team of 17 students not only had a handful of recent Christians from the previous semester, but that some of them actually met and gave their lives to Christ at the same project a year ago. One of those girls is Casey from China. It was only at the end of last year that Casey gave her life to Jesus after a group study on the life of Jesus. Although she was initially nervous about joining our project this year, all fears and nerves were gone when only on the 2nd day of project, God spoke through and used Casey to lead a fellow Chinese student to Christ. At the end of the two weeks, saw God work and watched as 12 other students from 3 different continents gave their lives to the Lord.

2017 O-Week

Praise God for how he continues to reveal himself to students from the 4 corners of the world in Brisbane! O-Week (Orientation Week) is one of the most strategic times of ministry every year as thousands of first years pour into University campus looking for opportunities to connect with the different clubs on campus. Especially since this year the ministry on Griffith is being Student-Led, it was a crucial for the future growth of the movement.

Thus this year, our prayer was that God would direct to us and our student leaders Christians wanting to make a spiritual impact on their campus and Non-Christians that the Spirit was already working. After a week of of Student Leaders meeting and connecting with hundreds of students at our stall, we were so encouraged to see around 70 people indicate they were either Christians wanting to connect with us, or non Christians that were interested in learning more about why Jesus mattered to Christianity.

We were especially proud of how 90% of the follow up for those 70 students were all done through our student leadership team. One of our student leaders Raya, is now weekly connecting together with a Catholic and Muslim girl to go through a resource we use that looks through the Life of Jesus.
