²⁸ After He had said these things, He was going on ahead, going up to Jerusalem.
²⁹ When He approached Bethphage and Bethany, near the mount that is called Olivet, He sent two of the disciples, ³⁰ saying, “Go into the village ahead of you; there, as you enter, you will find a colt tied on which no one yet has ever sat; untie it and bring it here.” ³¹ If anyone asks you, “Why are you untying it?” you shall say, “The Lord has need of it.”” ³² So those who were sent went away and found it just as He had told them. ³³ As they were untying the colt, its owners said to them, “Why are you untying the colt?” ³⁴ They said, “The Lord has need of it.” ³⁵ They brought it to Jesus, and they threw their coats on the colt and put Jesus on it. ³⁶ As He was going, they were spreading their coats on the road. ³⁷ As soon as He was approaching, near the descent of the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the miracles which they had seen, ³⁸ shouting:

“Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord;
 Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!”

³⁹ Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Him, “Teacher, rebuke Your disciples.”
⁴⁰ But Jesus answered, “I tell you, if these become silent, the stones will cry out!”
⁴¹ When He approached *Jerusalem*, He saw the city and wept over it, ⁴² saying, “If you had known in this day, even you, the things which make for peace! But now they have been hidden from your eyes. ⁴³ For the days will come upon you when your enemies will throw up a barricade against you, and surround you and hem you in on every side, ⁴⁴ and they will level you to the ground and your children within you, and they will not leave in you one stone upon another, because you did not recognize the time of your visitation.”

Lacrosse Team

At the beginning of this semester, I asked you to pray for an opportunity to start a Bible study on the Berry Men's Lacrosse team. God answered that prayer and brought 10 guys from the team to study the Bible for four weeks and to explore misconceptions of Christianity (i.e. we can be "good enough" for God). At the end of the four weeks, I had the opportunity to clearly communicate the Gospel. Each guy expressed excitement and interest in continuing the Bible study and a freshman named Evan became a Christian! Praise God for continuing to draw men and women to himself!

Counseling Leaders

This year God has continued to grow my vision and passion for counseling college students. I truly believe that healthy leaders grow and multiply their lives out, which fuels me to provide Biblical counseling to our student leaders. The past two weeks, I have had the privilege to visit other campuses in our region (Jacksonville State University and the University of North Alabama) to provide counseling to students and training on what it looks like to deal with anxiety, depression, and addiction.

Most of you know that last summer our son Owen was diagnosed with epilepsy after having multiple seizures. A particular trigger has not been identified, but his neurologist has put Owen on a medication to help decrease the likelihood of seizures. Over the past several months, Owen has continued to have seizures lasting anywhere from 5-10 minutes about once a month. Though it has been painful as parents to watch our child suffer, God has given us a lot of peace throughout this process.
