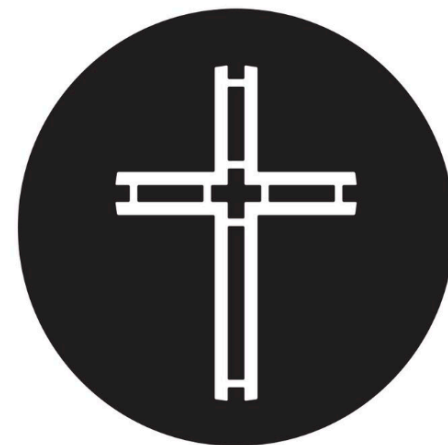
MISSION/MINISTRY HIGHLIGHT
