## A Broken Deliverer

### Judges 13:1-8 (NASB) | You Shall Bear a Son

Now the sons of Israel again did evil in the sight of the LORD, so that the LORD gave them into the hands of the Philistines forty years.

<sup>2</sup>There was a certain man of Zorah, of the family of the Danites, whose name was Manoah; and his wife was barren and had borne no *children*. <sup>3</sup>Then the angel of the LORD appeared to the woman and said to her, “Behold now, you are barren and have borne no *children*, but you shall conceive and give birth to a son. <sup>4</sup>Now therefore, be careful not to drink wine or strong drink, nor eat any unclean thing. <sup>5</sup>For behold, you shall conceive and give birth to a son, and no razor shall come upon his head, for the boy shall be a Nazirite to God from the womb; and he shall begin to deliver Israel from the hands of the Philistines.” <sup>6</sup>Then the woman came and told her husband, saying, “A man of God came to me and his appearance was like the appearance of the angel of God, very awesome. And I did not ask him where he *came* from, nor did he tell me his name. <sup>7</sup>But he said to me, ‘Behold, you shall conceive and give birth to a son, and now you shall not drink wine or strong drink nor eat any unclean thing, for the boy shall be a Nazirite to God from the womb to the day of his death.’”

<sup>8</sup>Then Manoah entreated the LORD and said, “O Lord, please let the man of God whom You have sent come to us again that he may teach us what to do for the boy who is to be born.”

### **Trinity Arts-Sports Camp 2017**

#### **Stories Jesus Told**

There are approximately 135 children registered and 90 workers – youth and adults. Many of the children registered are Trinity children but many are either un-churched or from other churches and Ledgewood.

The focus of Arts/Sports Camp is on the study of God's Word through Bible Study and Scripture memory work. The two blocks of elective activities are times when the children may choose activities that will train them to use talents and skills with which God has gifted them. There will be snacks and a time for fellowship as well as assemblies when we will enjoy praising our Savior.

Our daily lessons, which are reinforced through music and elective tracks, will look at four of Jesus' parables from Luke and how they relate to our new **purpose statement** as a church:
