GOD SENDS US

God’s Promise of His Presence and Blessing

Acts 2:1-13, 37-47 (NASB) | *A Catastrophic Wind* Chad Smith

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. ² And suddenly there came from heaven a noise like a violent rushing wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³ And there appeared to them tongues as of fire distributing themselves, and they rested on each one of them. ⁴ And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit was giving them utterance.

⁵ Now there were Jews living in Jerusalem, devout men from every nation under heaven. ⁶ And when this sound occurred, the crowd came together, and were bewildered because each one of them was hearing them speak in his own language. ⁷ They were amazed and astonished, saying, “Why, are not all these who are speaking Galileans?” ⁸ And how is it that we each hear *them* in our own language to which we were born? ⁹ Parthians and Medes and Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰ Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the districts of Libya around Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, ¹¹ Cretans and Arabs—we hear them in our own tongues speaking of the mighty deeds of God.”¹² And they all continued in amazement and great perplexity, saying to one another, “What does this mean?” ¹³ But others were mocking and saying, “They are full of sweet wine.”

³⁷ Now when they heard *this*, they were pierced to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, “Brethren, what shall we do?” ³⁸ Peter *said* to them, “Repent, and each of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. ³⁹ For the promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off, as many as the Lord our God will call to Himself.” ⁴⁰ And with many other words he solemnly testified and kept on exhorting them, saying, “Be saved from this perverse generation!” ⁴¹ So then, those who had received his word were baptized; and that day there were added about three thousand souls. ⁴² They were continually devoting themselves to the apostles’ teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.

⁴³ Everyone kept feeling a sense of awe; and many wonders and signs were taking place through the apostles. ⁴⁴ And all those who had believed were together and had all things in common; ⁴⁵ and they *began* selling their property and possessions and were sharing them with all, as anyone might have need. ⁴⁶ Day by day continuing with one mind in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they were taking their meals together with gladness and sincerity of heart, ⁴⁷ praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord was adding to their number day by day those who were being saved.

Reformed University Fellowship – Western Carolina University

If you ask our daughter "where are you and mommy and daddy going?" Sophie will reply, "to the mountains!" Whether or not a two-year old can really grasp what it means to move, she's right: we're headed to the mountains! I have been called as the RUF Campus Minister at Western Carolina University, and can't wait to get started!

The past few weeks have been a jumble of emotions for us: excitement as we think about moving to Cullowhee, NC for campus ministry, anticipation as we imagine raising a family there, inspiration as we brainstorm about events and activities to do with students, grief at leaving our wonderful church and friends in Hilton Head, and so much more.

Why RUF? - RUF (Reformed University Fellowship) is a ministry that I have loved since my days as a student at NC State. It plays a huge role in my testimony through my 5 years at NC State and 2 years of internship with RUF at Virginia Tech. I couldn't be more excited to have been called to work with RUF as a campus minister!

On the Campus - One of the things I love about RUF is that they meet students where they are. Whether that's the student center or dining hall, the library or intramural field, RUF goes to students on their own turf.

For the Church - RUF is not the church: RUF exists for the church. They know that students are only in RUF for a few years, but that they will be part of a church for the rest of their lives. RUF seeks to prepare students for a life in the local church; loving and serving, growing and giving

What Is RUF? Reformed University Fellowship is the campus ministry of the Presbyterian Church in America (PCA). They place seminary trained, ordained pastors on college campuses around the country to reach students for Christ and equip students to serve. They do this on campuses through three primary avenues: 1. *Large Group*: a weekly meeting, where students sing together and hear God's Word preached. 2. *Small Groups*: weekly Bible studies or book discussion groups focused on knowing God's Word and growing in grace. 3. *One-on-One*: discipleship, evangelism, and counseling. In addition to these primary avenues of ministry, RUFs plan social events, service projects, mission trips, and a fall and summer conference. In all this, they seek to glorify God and serve His Church by reaching and equipping students.

How Can I Help? There are many ways that you can be a part of our ministry with RUF:

- **Prayer:** college is a transformative time in life, but the campus can be a very dark place. Pray for us, that we would be able to winsomely and compellingly share the good news of the gospel.
