³⁶While they were telling these things, He Himself stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be to you."³⁷ But they were startled and frightened and thought that they were seeing a spirit.³⁸ And He said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts arise in your hearts?³⁹ See My hands and My feet, that it is I Myself; touch Me and see, for a spirit does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have."⁴⁰ And when He had said this, He showed them His hands and His feet.⁴¹ While they still could not believe it because of their joy and amazement, He said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?"⁴² They gave Him a piece of a broiled fish;⁴³ and He took it and ate it before them.⁴⁴ Now He said to them, "These are My words which I spoke to you while I was still with you, that all things which are written about Me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled."⁴⁵ Then He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures.

Greetings, Room does not allow for us to report on all of the projects that we have been involved with since our last report, so here is a report on just a few of our most recent projects:

In 2014, Dale had started on the design of new cottages to house the older children of the HOLD the Children Home in La Vaud, Port de Paix, Haiti (www.holdthechildren.org). Then the project was put on hold (pun intended) until late 2015, as HTC had to re-shuffle their project priorities. The design and drawings for the cottages, which turned into a single duplex, were finally completed in the Spring of 2016. A ground-breaking ceremony was held on April 4, 2016 and construction began on Phase 1 (the foundation and floor slab). The new duplex cottage will be home to the older children, under the supervision of houseparents, and will provide the opportunities for the children to develop life-skills (cooking, chores, etc.) that they will need when they eventually leave the home to establish their own families.

Helps Ministries has recently been asked to design a transitional home, called Restoration Home for Mirror Ministries of Richland, WA. Dale has recently completed the preliminary drawings for a 6,000 sf home for Mirror Ministries. The home will be for the restoration of minor girls being rescued from the sex trafficking trade. Mirror Ministries’ mission is to respond to domestic sex trafficking with the love of Christ through intervention and restorative services while motivating many to respond to the global human trafficking crisis with justice and mercy.

Edward & Christine Isingoma, Helps Ministries MPP’s (Ministry Partner Program), who operate New Life School in Hoima, Uganda, had asked Grace Community Church in Asheville, NC to partner with them in constructing a four-classroom building for their school in Uganda. They already had approved drawings, but they asked Dale to provide approximate costs for construction of their school building. Dale was also asked to prepare drawings for a set of ventilated pit latrines for the school. Through the financial assistance of Grace Community Church, construction of the school AND latrines have been completed. The money for the latrines was raised through an affiliate Helps Ministries ministry, Knickers for New Life. KFNL partners with one school at a time in Uganda to provide knickers and sanitary supplies, along with health and hygiene education, as well as funds for separate latrines for girls and boys. Started in 2016, by Grace Community Church member, Watha Kollmeyer, KFNL raises funds through Bead Workshops, jewelry sales, and direct charitable contributions. Watha has also requested that Dale send the latrine drawings to another school in Bundibugy, Uganda, which KFNL has also raised funds for the construction of new latrines. In fact, those latrines are also now being under construction.

Like many other mission agencies, Helps Ministries is changing and adapting to new models for missions in the modern world. Helps has found that where traditionally missions have sought out workers to fill slots in their already established ministries, now new gifted workers are being called to serve, not in established ministries, but in their own ministries, utilizing their own unique vision and giftedness. And so Helps has established its **Ministry Partnership Program** which actively partners with missionaries and ministries by providing them with operational, administrative, and technical support services. In that vein of thinking, Helps’ *Planning & Design Ministry* was the only remaining stand-alone department trying to operate with its own budget and structure and did not fit the new model for ministry. And so it was decided to drop the structured departmental model and move Dale to the **Ministry Partnership Program**. Helps still provides architectural design, but now through individual ministry partners serving with Helps- such as Dale at the home office, David F. in Southeast Asia, and volunteer Ed Luebben in Washington State. Currently Helps has almost thirty units (a unit can be single or married) of “MPP’s”, who function much like the traditional field missionary, in many countries around the globe.

We are grateful for the continued financial and prayer support of our friends and family - for without you we could not continue, by the Grace of God, in the Service of the King of Kings.
