### **GOD SPEAKS TO US**

### \* Scripture Reading

Romans 8 (NASB 1995)

<sup>1</sup> Therefore there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. <sup>2</sup> For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death. <sup>3</sup> For what the Law could not do, weak as it was through the flesh, God did: sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and as an offering for sin, He condemned sin in the flesh, <sup>4</sup> so that the requirement of the Law might be fulfilled in us, who do not walk according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. <sup>5</sup> For those who are according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who are according to the Spirit, the things of the Spirit. <sup>6</sup> For the mind set on the flesh is death, but the mind set on the Spirit is life and peace, <sup>7</sup> because the mind set on the flesh is hostile toward God; for it does not subject itself to the law of God, for it is not even able to do so, <sup>8</sup> and those who are in the flesh cannot please God.

<sup>9</sup> However, you are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if indeed the Spirit of God dwells in you. But if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he does not belong to Him. <sup>10</sup> If Christ is in you, though the body is dead because of sin, yet the spirit is alive because of righteousness. <sup>11</sup> But if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, He who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His Spirit who dwells in you.

<sup>12</sup> So then, brethren, we are under obligation, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh — <sup>13</sup> for if you are living according to the flesh, you must die; but if by the Spirit you are putting to death the deeds of the body, you will live. <sup>14</sup> For all who are being led by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God. <sup>15</sup> For you have not received a spirit of slavery leading to fear again, but you have received a spirit of adoption as sons by which we cry out, "Abba! Father!" <sup>16</sup> The Spirit Himself testifies with our spirit that we are children of

God, <sup>17</sup> and if children, heirs also, heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, if indeed we suffer with Him so that we may also be glorified with Him.

<sup>18</sup> For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory that is to be revealed to us. <sup>19</sup> For the anxious longing of the creation waits eagerly for the revealing of the sons of God. <sup>20</sup> For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of Him who subjected it, in hope <sup>21</sup> that the creation itself also will be set free from its slavery to corruption into the freedom of the glory of the children of God. <sup>22</sup> For we know that the whole creation groans and suffers the pains of childbirth together until now. <sup>23</sup> And not only this, but also we ourselves, having the first fruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting eagerly for our adoption as sons, the redemption of our body. <sup>24</sup> For in hope we have been saved, but hope that is seen is not hope; for who hopes for what he already sees? <sup>25</sup> But if we hope for what we do not see, with perseverance we wait eagerly for it.

<sup>26</sup> In the same way the Spirit also helps our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we should, but the Spirit Himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words; <sup>27</sup> and He who searches the hearts knows what the mind of the Spirit is, because He intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.

<sup>28</sup> And we know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose. <sup>29</sup> For those whom He foreknew, He also predestined to become conformed to the image of His Son, so that He would be the firstborn among many brethren; <sup>30</sup> and these whom He predestined, He also called; and these whom He called, He also justified; and these whom He justified, He also glorified.

<sup>31</sup> What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who is against us? <sup>32</sup> He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him over for us all, how will He not also with Him freely give us all things? <sup>33</sup> Who will bring a charge against God's elect? God is the one who justifies; <sup>34</sup> who is the one who condemns? Christ Jesus is He who died, yes, rather who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who also intercedes for us. <sup>35</sup> Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? <sup>36</sup> Just as it is written,

"For Your sake we are being put to death all day long; We were considered as sheep to be slaughtered."

<sup>37</sup> But in all these things we overwhelmingly conquer through Him who loved us. <sup>38</sup> For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, <sup>39</sup> nor height, nor depth, nor any other created thing, will be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

# Understanding the Gospel

John 3:16 tells us: "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life."

This passage answers basic questions of who, what, why, when, and how. Please ask any of our church leaders to talk with you about what the Bible says about Jesus.

- God so loved the world...
  - God loved the world in such a way to rescue people from their sins against Him (John 3:17; Il Corinthians 5:21).
- · He gave His only begotten Son...
  - He sent His Son to live among us, to show us His love, and to pay the penalty for our sins through His death on the cross (Romans 5:8; 6:23).
- · That whoever believes in Him...
  - Believing in Christ means trusting in Him as the One who fully paid for our sins, and turning from our sins (including trusting in ourselves). It means receiving His free gift of salvation and full forgiveness, and trusting His Lordship in our lives (John 1:12; Ephesians 2:8-10; I John 5:11,12).
- · Shall not perish, but have everlasting life.

Through faith in Jesus, we have eternal life and a family relationship with God as our Father. Because we trust Jesus as the One who died for our sins, we are rescued from God's judgment and have new life in His name (John 5:24; John 10:10; John 11:25, 26).

When I survey the wondrous cross on which the Prince of glory died, my richest gain I count but loss, and pour contempt on all my pride.

Forbid it, Lord, that I should boast, save in the death of Christ my God: all the vain things that charm me most, I sacrifice them to his blood.

See, from his head, his hands, his feet, sorrow and love flow mingled down: did e'er such love and sorrow meet, or thorns compose so rich a crown?

Were the whole realm of nature mine that were a present far too small; love so amazing, so divine, demands my soul, my life, my all.

# **MISSION FOCUS**

# **Asheville Buncombe Community Christian Ministry**

We have moved our headquarters to consolidate some of our services and expand our capacity to feed families and help families with furniture and household items .. all in a huge warehouse. Our new address is: 1845 Brevard Road, Arden, NC 28704.

This was effective July 1. All other ministry services will remain where they are. You can still take donations to the Crisis Ministry warehouses, but our main warehouse services will be at the new location. We are consolidating these offices: ABCCM Servant Leadership Center – Veterans Services of the Carolinas – and centralizing the warehouse operations of the Donations Ministry.

ABCCM began with Crisis Ministry services in 1969 and has expanded to meet needs as they arose. The newest expansion requires much more space. ABCCM is a partner in The Healthy Opportunities Program that serves Medicaid families. This program allows us to reach our low-income neighbors who are experiencing health challenges and provides support need to help them stay stable and healthier. The Statewide report showed this approach was a big success. These families receive a healthy food box that is delivered weekly. The program also provides financial assistance for first month's rent/deposit and/or utility assistance. A Food Navigator and a Housing Navigator were added to each Crisis Ministry site to deliver these services, along with our faithful and committed volunteers.

Since January, the combined Crisis Ministry sites have been giving away about 18,000 bags of food a month, with 6,000 bags for Medicaid families, but 12,000 bags from the churches and community to help all the other families in need. Thanks to all the volunteers and churches, ABCCM is impacting thousands. Currently we are serving 550 Medicaid families weekly with a healthy food box filled with fresh produce, staple items, proteins and dairy. We are serving about 200 families monthly with housing and sustaining resources to keep them supported during difficult times.

Veterans Services of the Carolinas serves Veterans and their families with homeless prevention and rapid rehousing, job training and placement, suicide prevention, and outreach services. They serve all 100 NC counties with a call center which connects Veteran with services they need, which may require multiple calls by VSC to make the right connection for the Veteran.

This Servant Leadership team includes the officers who support the operations of all seven ministries. This includes financial accounting, plus church shepherding, fund raising, special events, printing and mailing, data services, and personnel.
