# Understanding the Gospel

John 3:16 tells us: "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life."

This passage answers basic questions of who, what, why, when, and how. Please ask any of our church leaders to talk with you about what the Bible says about lesus.

- God so loved the world...
  - God loved the world in such a way to rescue people from their sins against Him (John 3:17; Il Corinthians 5:21).
- · He gave His only begotten Son...
  - He sent His Son to live among us, to show us His love, and to pay the penalty for our sins through His death on the cross (Romans 5:8; 6:23).
- That whoever believes in Him...
  - Believing in Christ means trusting in Him as the One who fully paid for our sins, and turning from our sins (including trusting in ourselves). It means receiving His free gift of salvation and full forgiveness, and trusting His Lordship in our lives (John 1:12; Ephesians 2:8-10; I John 5:11,12).
- · Shall not perish, but have everlasting life.

Through faith in Jesus, we have eternal life and a family relationship with God as our Father. Because we trust Jesus as the One who died for our sins, we are rescued from God's judgment and have new life in His name (John 5:24; John 10:10; John 11:25, 26).

Thy works, not mine, O Christ, speak gladness to this heart; they tell me all is done; they bid my fear depart.

(Refrain)
To whom, save thee, who canst alone for sin atone, Lord, shall I flee?

Thy pains, not mine, O Christ, upon the shameful tree, have paid the law's full price and purchased peace for me. (*Ref.*)

Thy cross, not mine, O Christ, has borne the awful load of sins that none in heav'n or earth could bear but God. (*Ref.*)

Thy righteousness, O Christ, alone can cover me: no righteousness avails save that which is of thee. (*Ref.*)
