Our Worship Service has an intentional structure designed to reflect our belief that worship is a conversation between God and His people. The service begins as we all respond to God's **calling** us to worship Him. But upon responding to that call, we realize that we must be reminded of the **cleansing** given to us through Christ. God then gives us His **charter** as we hear Him speak through Scripture. This is followed by the heavenly feast called **communion**. Finally, God dismisses us with His blessing in the **commission**.

There are a few options for your children. Whole families worshipping together is one of the chief values of Trinity. While our kids may not grasp everything that takes place, their hearts are being formed through participating in the weekly act of worship and observing the people of God singing, praying, and giving their hearts to God! We have children's bulletins and Bibles available in the foyer. For our youngest kids, a staffed nursery is available, Room 101 is a dedicated cry room for nursing mothers, and children ages two through five are given the choice of attending children's worship in Room 104; dismissal is before the sermon.

Adapted from a Prayer by Reformer Zacharius Ursinus (1534-1583), one of the authors of the Heidelberg Catechism

We, as poor sinners, confess before you, our God and Creator, that we have sinned gravely and in various ways against you–not only with outward sins, but much more with internal sins such as innate blindness, unbelief, doubts, faintheartedness, impatience, pride, greed, secret envy, hatred, and jealousy, as well as other evil ways. You, our Lord and God, recognize this in us very well, but we cannot recognize our sins sufficiently. Forgive us, Lord, and give us grace through your dear Son, Jesus Christ. Amen.
